# Riverside County Workforce Investment Board Goes Green!



HE RIVERSIDE COUNTY Workforce Investment Board (WIB) has embarked on the "Green Journey." At last year's Holiday WIB meeting, the Green Valley Initiative recognized the Board for its commitment to a more sustainable future for the Inland Empire. This promise is demonstrated through their educational partnerships and financial support for green jobs training in renewable energies, solar

> photovoltaic and wind power systems, alternative fuel vehicle maintenance, home weatherization and more.

> The WIB continues to develop, sustain, and strengthen its partnerships to provide

job seekers opportunities to enhance their skills that will be useful in green industries.

One such initiative began

with the wind turbine training class of October 2009.

Approximately 15 students attended the course at the College of the Desert in Coachella Valley completing 208 hours of classroom instruction (equal to 268-hour sessions). One hundred percent of the students in the program graduated. The upcoming class is already full and a third is set to begin March 15.

Suiter, a single mother who was on welfare for three years, is now a travel trainer with Blindness Support Services, Inc. (BSS) in Riverside where she teaches people with disabilities how to travel on public transportation. Suiter had volunteered with the BSS through the Volunteer Center of Riverside County where she put in more hours than were required. She received onthe-job training through the County's workforce development system.

## CONGRESSWOMAN BONO MACK HOST INDIO JOB FAIR

ON NOVEMBER 13, 2009, Congresswoman Mary Bono Mack hosted a job fair at the Indio Workforce Development Center (WDC) emphasizing the importance of expanding opportunities for job seekers and local businesses. Approximately 800 job seekers attended the event to learn more about jobs



that were available and services provided at the WDC.

Prior to the fair, one hundred enrolled WDC members participated in a preparatory workshop on interviewing techniques. Those members were also the first ones to meet with the 24 employers from various industries such as service and hospitality, healthcare, care-giving, as well as communications, security and the military. WI
